#### **REPORTS**

#### **Board of Education President,** Dan Burns:

Dan Burns reported on the ALICE training, Volley for a Cure game against Garfield, Camp Fitch and Homecoming.

## Maplewood Career Center Representative, Darryl McGuire:

Darryl McGuire reported that the carpentry class at Maplewood would be building a pavilion at Ravenna City Park and a pole building for a retired teacher.

#### **Legislative Liaison,** Darryl McGuire:

Darryl McGuire reported that Ohio cut school funding by \$1.8 million in 2012 the 7<sup>th</sup> highest amount in the United States. He also reported that two thirds of Ohioans trust their school board, fifteen percent trust the state superintendent, six point six percent trust the governor and three point three trust the state legislature to make good decisions about education policies. Half of Ohioans say new revenue from shale oil and gas should be used to restore cuts to local governments and schools, one third say the money should be used to lower state income taxes.

Two thirds of Ohioans oppose using public funds to pay for tuition for students to attend private or parochial schools. Fifty percent of Ohioans think it is a good idea to use student test data to rate school quality, while forty-one percent think it is a bad idea. Forty-eight percent of Ohioans think the local report card rating was "somewhat" influential when it comes to their opinion about the quality of education provided to students, thirty percent said the rating was "very "influential and sixteen percent said "not at all".

#### Superintendent, Gregg Isler:

Gregg Isler reported that preliminary results show the district meeting 17 indicators for 2011/2012. He reported on the meetings with Epiphany regarding the technology in the district and the high school grant received last year. He reported on policy changes needed for the third grade reading guarantee. He also reported on the construction of a new baseball/softball complex being funded by the Athletic Boosters.

#### Special Services, Bob Kujala:

Bob Kujala reported via Gregg Isler that they met with the SST8 to review the special education audit process on September 10<sup>th</sup>. The purpose of the audit is to strengthen Windham Schools special education program and to ensure compliance with all special education laws and procedures. Audit officials will look at discipline procedures, process of creating and implementing ETR and IEP, the gifted program, funding and how it is reported to the state, random student sampling, interview teachers and parents. The audit will take place the week of April 8, 2013. SST8 will begin working with administrators October 1, 2012 and special education teachers October 25, 2012. They will work through a mock audit and help identify concerns. Mr. Kujala recommends that the board hire an intervention specialist to separate the resource room students in grades nine and ten from the junior high students.

### **Supervisor of Maintenance/Transportation, Craig Alderman:**

Craig Alderman reported that he would like to see the maintenance and transportation departments become 21<sup>st</sup> century departments. He proposed five recommendations to the board:

- 1. Rebuild two pre-action valves in the gyms.
- 2. Replace up to two boilers with energy efficient ones on the JHS/HS. One boiler is down and has been for 18 months.
- 3. Purchase a natural gas generator for JHS/HS to run sump pumps in case of power outage.
- 4. Purchase four additional camera recording units for buses.
- 5. Purchase eight bus radios for the entire bus fleet.

### **Supervisor of Food Service/Treasurer,** Samantha Pochedly:

Samantha Pochedly reported that rooms were gotten for Capital Conference at the Hilton Downtown next to the Convention Center. She attended training on the additional six cent reimbursement for new menu compliance, menus will be sent to ODE in October. She applied for the Medicaid School Program to attempt to recoup some of the costs associated with the special education program. She and Mr. Isler have been working on getting a new phone system installed; a quote was distributed to the board.
